The Modern United Way



United Way's Community Action Fund invests in multiple areas, to reach a hand out to many and give the building blocks of a successful life to all in Sheboygan County.

A gift to United Way's Community Action Fund goes to needs everyone is aware of but also to needs that are less obvious, but no less important. Our community's problems are interrelated, and only the Community Action Fund's diversity of programs work together to address the complex issues—in a way that no single agency, donor, volunteer, or sector of the community can do alone. - Providing Access to Healing (PATH): Provides confidential licensed mental health therapists in all public-school districts throughout Sheboygan County. PATH creates increased access to services for youth by removing financial and geographical barriers.
- Volunteer Center: Volunteers are a crucial part of general operations and special events for nonprofit agencies. The Volunteer Center helps connect you, your family or your team to the right volunteer opportunity in our community.
