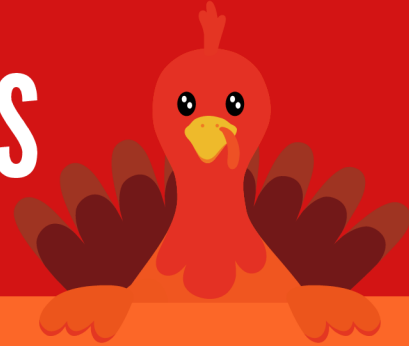

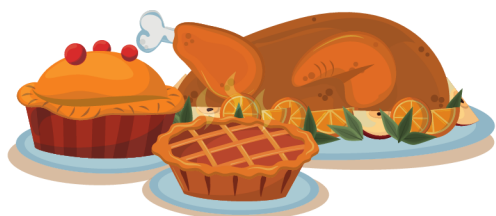
Head Start Open Enrollment
