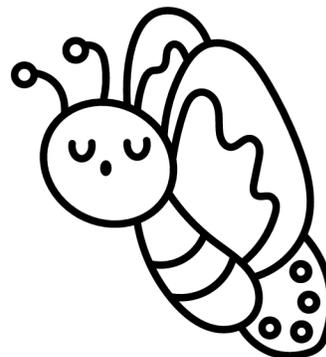
## Baby Steps
