WHY DO I NEED TO COMPLETE ADVANCED HEALTH CARE PLANNING? If you are 18 years old or older, suffer a health crisis and cannot make decisions for yourself, it allows your designated person to make health care decisions for you, the way you would want those decisions to be made. In Wisconsin, a family member is not automatically allowed to make health care decisions for you if you have not completed an advanced health care decision document. You will have the opportunity to create and legally sign your advanced care documents at this event.
